

**OFFICIAL EMBLEM**  
**MINISTERIAL REGULATION**  
**NOTIFICATION IN CASE OF DEATH OR LOSS OF THE STATUS OF A JURISTIC PERSON**  
**B.E. 2562 (2019)**

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By virtue of the provisions pursuant to Section 5 paragraph one, and Section 36 paragraph three of the Pathogens and Animal Toxins Act B.E. 2558 (2015), the Minister of Public Health has issued the following Ministerial Regulation.

Clause 1 In the case where the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license who is a natural person dies, his/her heir shall notify the Director-General within fifteen days from the death date of the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license.

In the event of emergency or necessity, or in the case where the heir fails to notify by himself/herself pursuant to paragraph one, the executor, the operator or the operation personnel shall notify the Director-General.

Clause 2 In the case where the heir intends not to continue to produce, import, export, sell, transit, or possess the pathogens or animal toxins, the production, import, export, sale, or transit of pathogens or animal toxins shall be terminated, and the heir or the executor shall further destroy or hand over the remaining pathogens or animal toxins pursuant to Section 35.

It shall be deemed that the notification pursuant to Section 1 is a notification of termination of production, import, export, sale, transit or possession of pathogens or animal toxins pursuant to Section 33.

Clause 3 In the case where the heir intends to continue to produce, import, export, sell, transit, or possess the pathogens or animal toxins, the production, import, export, sale, or transit of pathogens or animal toxins shall be temporarily discontinued, and the heir shall apply for a certificate of notification or apply for a license pursuant to Section 21 or Section 22 as the case may be. However, in the said applying for a certificate of notification or applying for a license, the notification document shall be attached pursuant to Clause 1.

In the case where the Director-General orders not issue a certificate of notification or a license to the heir, the production, import, export, sale, or transit of pathogens or animal toxins shall be terminated, and the heir or the executor shall destroy or hand over the remaining pathogens or animal toxins pursuant to Section 35 from the received date of such order.

Clause 4 In the case where the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license who is a juristic person loses the status of a juristic person, the liquidator, the operator or the operation personnel shall notify the Director-General within fifteen days from the date of which the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license loses the status of the juristic person, and shall terminate the production, import, export, sale or transit of pathogens or animal toxins. The liquidator shall further destroy or hand over the remaining pathogens or animal toxins pursuant to Section 35.

It shall be deemed that the notification pursuant to paragraph one is a notification of termination of production, import, export, sale, transit, or possession of pathogens or animal toxins pursuant to Section 33.

Clause 5 The notification pursuant to Clause 1 and Clause 4 shall be in line with the form specified and promulgated by the Director-General in the Government Gazette.

Clause 6 In the case where the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license dies or loses the status of juristic person prior to the effective date hereof, the person pursuant to Clause 1 or Clause 4, as the case, may be shall notify the Director-General within fifteen days from the effective date hereof.

Remark :- The reason to promulgate this Ministerial Regulation is the legislation of Section 36 paragraph one and paragraph three of the Pathogens and Animal Toxins Act B.E. 2558 (2015) that in case where the person receiving a certificate of notification or the person receiving a license dies or loses the status of a juristic person, the heir, executor, liquidator, operator, or operation personnel shall notify the Director-General of the Department of Medical Sciences. The said notification shall be in accordance with the rules, procedures, and conditions prescribed in the Ministerial Regulation. Therefore, the issuance of this Ministerial Regulation is required.
